2. Appalling	(adj.) outrageous; terrible <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Synonym – awful, horrible • Antonym – beautiful, comforting
3. Brevity	(n.) shortness <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Synonym – conciseness • Antonym - lengthiness
4. Compensation	(n.) payment <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Synonym – fee, reimbursement • Antonym - debt, loss
5. Counterargument	(n.) an opposing point of view <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Synonym - counterclaim • Antonym - agreement
6. Dissenter	(n.) one who disagrees or hold a different opinion <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Synonym - protester • Antonym - conformer
7. Entitlement	(n.) the state of having a right or claim to something <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Synonym – benefit, privilege • Antonym – prohibition
8. Rebuttal	(n.) to refute by evidence or argument <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Synonym - counterargument, defense • Antonym - agreement, confirmation
9. Stereotyping	(v.) to believe unfairly that all people or things with a particular characteristic are the same <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Synonym – typecast, generalize • Antonym - differentiate
10. Voracious	(adj.) possessing an insatiable desire; greedy <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Synonym - unsatisfied • Antonym - satisfied

1. Area	(n.) a division of experience, activity, or knowledge; a field <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Synonym – range, department
2. Claim	(v.) to state as a fact (n.) the statement of the truth of something <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Synonym: (v.) assert, declare; (n.) assertion, declaration • Antonym: challenge, denial
3. Domain	(n.) a geographical area over which rule or control is exercised <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Synonym - area, department
4. Hypothesis/Thesis	(n.) a suggested explanation that needs further testing or investigation; a statement to be proven <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Synonym – theory • Antonym – proof, fact
5. Intent/Intention	(n.) purpose, meaning or significance <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Synonym- resolve, goal • Antonym - accident
6. Objective	(n.) something worked toward or striven for (adj.) based on facts, not feelings <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Synonym – (n.) goal, aim; (adj.) equitable, impartial • Antonym – (adj.) subjective, biased
7. Plagiarism	(n.) copying another person’s idea or written work and claiming it as your own <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Synonym – copying, stealing • Antonym – original
8. Quotation	(n.) An excerpt that is taken exactly, word for word <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • synonym – excerpt • antonym - paraphrase
9. Resolve	(v.) to make a decision about, or to solve a problem <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Synonym- revenge, retaliation • Antonym - forgiveness
10. Strategy	(n.) a careful plan or method <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Synonym – arrangement, procedure • Antonym – coincidence
